


Species permitting update

European protected species applications - Method Statement

Please note future applications must use the standard template.

Shrew trapping licences

We're changing the way we licence shrew trapping. Instead of applying for an individual licence you will soon be able to download a general licence to cover you. From February simply download the licence and ensure you comply with all the conditions, including the reporting condition. This is one of a number of streamlining measures we're currently considering.
